



Construction of upgrades and improvements to the Long Branch Sewer Authority (LBSA) NJDEP Project No. S340336-09 2018 Capital Improvements Projects - Collection System, located at the Hoey Ave Pump Station and nearby roadways and areas throughout Long Branch for the inflow/infiltration study and rehabilitation project and the sanitary sewer railroad crossing investigation/rehabilitation project, with an estimated cost of \$5,237,000, were financed by the New Jersey Water Bank (NJWB). The NJWB is a State Revolving Fund program jointly administered by the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) and the New Jersey Infrastructure Bank (Infrastructure Bank) and uses a combination of funds provided by the United States Environmental Protection Agency, the DEP, and the Infrastructure Bank to provide very low interest loans to borrowers for environmental infrastructure projects.

This project will provide water quality benefits in the form of improved effluent quality during peak flow periods, reduce the potential for sewage exfiltration and reduce maintenance and operating problems and costs; reduce inflow and infiltration and reduce the need for emergency repairs; address environmental issues; improve reliability and efficiency of sewer service in the City of Long Branch.
